VOTE.....

General Election

Tuesday November 2, 2010

In order to vote, you must:

- ⇒ Be a U.S. Citizen;
- ⇒ Be at least 18 years old on Election Day;
- ⇒ Have resided in Minnesota for at least 20 days prior to Election Day;
- ⇒ Have any felony conviction completed or discharged;
- ⇒ Have not had your voting rights revoked by a court; and
- ⇒ Have not been found legally incompetent by a court.

Polls are open from 7 A.M.—8 P.M.

Voting Absentee

Minnesota voters who are unable to get to their polling places on Election Day can still participate in our democracy and vote. The process is called voting by absentee ballot.

A voter may vote by absentee for one of the following reasons:

Absence from the precinct (away from home)

Illness or disability

Serving as an election judge in another precinct

Obtain an application online at www.co.carver.mn.us, at City Hall or at Carver County Tax Payer Services.

VOTER REGISTRATION

Registration Information

You will need to register if **any** of the following apply: 1) If you are new to the City of Watertown, 2) changed your name in the last two years, 3) changed your address, or 4) have not voted in an election within the last four years.

You have until **October 12th at 5:00 p.m.** to pre-register to vote. After that time, you will need to do Election Day Registration.

Pre-registration can be done by mail or in person at one of the following locations:

- ⇒ Carver County Government Center (Taxpayer Services) 600 E 4th Street Chaska
- ⇒ All county libraries
- ⇒ The Secretary of State's office
- ⇒ The Carver County License Center

You may register to vote when you apply for or renew your driver's license.

Election Day Registration

Before Election Day, November 2, 2010, you can go to the Carver County website under **elections and click on the link titled "Am I registered to vote?"** Follow the instructions listed and you can find out if you are on the roster for election day. This link will also give you your polling place location.

If you are not registered, you will need to do so at your polling place before you can vote. Please allow extra time for this process. To expedite the process, please have the following with you:

Photo ID With Current Address in the Precinct (MN Driver's License, MN ID Card) OR

Photo ID with a fee statement. (Below are acceptable Photo ID's and fee statements)

⇒ **Photo ID** (May be expired)

Minnesota Driver's License

Minnesota ID Card

United States Passport

United States Military ID Card

Tribal ID Card



⇒ **Bills** (delivered electronically or by mail)

⇒ Utility Bill due **within 30 days** of Election Day:

Telephone (Landline, cell, VOIP)

TV (cable or satellite)

Internet service

Electric / Gas

Municipal Water & Sewer

Or you can have a registered voter from your voting precinct vouch for you.
